In multiplying any number by 21, or 31, or 401, or any number of two figures where the last is one, or of three figures, where the last two figures are 01, a good deal of time can be saved by abbreviating the ordinary process as here illustrated. For Jul 4- -5 instance, suppose we have to multiply 231,423 by 4628460 2i. Instead of putting down 231,423 with 2 /1QKQQQQ under it, then drawing a line, multiplying by 1. then by 2 or 20, then adding, as is the ordinary custom; all that is necessary is simply to multiply by the 2, placing the product, one figure to the left, and then to add. Try this method, using 31, 51, 61, 91, 2or, 3,001, and 901...



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
